#### Thought for the Week — from Caroline

*Psalm 23, verse 1: "The Lord is my shepherd; I have everything I need."*

This week meditate on this one verse. All week keep saying it to yourself, when you get up and when you go to bed, when you are at work, shopping or with the children. Say it when you are relaxed or stressed in difficult situations or with difficult people. Just say it anywhere all the time and especially if you have negative or anxious thoughts.

A shepherd:

1. protects his sheep from danger and enemies;
2. provides food and shelter for his sheep;
3. knows when they are sick or injured and tenderly cares for them and carries them;
4. knows when they are lost or go astray and looks for them;
5. gives extra protection in harsh environments;
6. protects the young and nursing mothers;
7. knows what makes them anxious and calms them;
8. recognises the bleating of his sheep and they know his voice.

A Jewish shepherd had a lonely hard job but he was totally committed to his flock. When Jesus walked on this earth it would have been very hard and very lonely at times but he was committed to you then, He is now and always will be.

*Luke 12, verse 32: "Do not be afraid, little flock, for your Father is pleased to give you the Kingdom."*
