Thought for the Week – from Caroline

Romans 8:35 *Who will separate us from the love of Christ?*

The UCB Word for Today for 12th June talks about how Paul went through worst case scenarios of danger and trouble. These included persecution or famine or nakedness or danger or sword, stoned and left for dead, shipwrecked, bitten by a poisonous snake and five times he received the maximum sentence of forty lashes. What interested me was this:

“Hardship has one of two effects: it either hardens or softens our hearts. And it’s that hardening or softening that makes us or breaks us. Research in psychology shows that between half and two-thirds of people who survive extreme hardship or crisis later experience positive personal changes – a phenomenon known as post-traumatic growth. It’s the tough times that test our love. But that’s also how it’s proved.

“The love of Christ wasn’t proved by His miracles – it was proved on a Roman cross. And it has proven to be fail-proof. So no matter what trouble, hardship, or persecution you face, this too shall pass. More importantly, Jesus is with you and Jesus is for you. Nothing, absolutely nothing, can separate you from His love!”

This is so true, I have met people who have been through so much but they “come out the other side” with compassion and understanding and have a deep insight into other’s problems, they probably would never have become like that had they not suffered. And I have also met people whose hearts have become bitter, unforgiving and seeking revenge.

Like Dave always says, “Endeavour to end well,” and I know I want to be like the first group with wisdom, love, understanding, compassionate and a soft heart. I’m working on it by the grace of God even though I confess I have a cynical streak.
