Timothy Keller, an American pastor (1950-2023) wrote a book called "The Reason for God" in which he addresses the questions many ask like, "Why does God allow suffering in the world?" "How can a loving God send people to Hell?" and many more. He is also known for his quotes which I like and want to share a few with you, for example:

- We are more sinful and flawed in ourselves than we ever dared to believe, yet at the very same time we are more loved and accepted in Jesus Christ than we ever dared hope.
- The church is a hospital for sinners not a museum for saints.
- To stay away from Christianity because part of the Bible's teachings is offensive to you assumes that if there is a God He wouldn't have any views that upset you. Does that belief make sense?
- All the beauty we have looked for in art or faces or places – and all the love we have looked for in the arms of other people – is only fully present in God Himself.
