Below are people who made catastrophic mistakes. I'm not saying I'm in that league.

Famous Bible Figures Who Recovered from Big Mistakes

King David

- The Mistake: David committed adultery with Bathsheba and then arranged for her husband, Uriah, to be killed in battle to cover it up.
- The Recovery: David confessed his sin, repented deeply, and remained a central leader whom God called a "man after my own heart." He wrote many Psalms of remorse and praise.

The Apostle Peter

- The Mistake: Peter promised he would never leave Jesus, but he denied knowing Him three times out of fear when Jesus was arrested.
- The Recovery: Peter wept bitterly, received forgiveness from Jesus after the resurrection, and became a bold leader of the early church.

Moses

- The Mistake: Moses killed an Egyptian taskmaster in anger and fled into the desert, spending 40 years as a humble shepherd.
- The Recovery: God called Moses from a burning bush to lead the Israelites out of slavery in Egypt. He became one of the greatest prophets in history.

The Apostle Paul (Saul)

- The Mistake: Paul violently persecuted, imprisoned, and approved the killing of early Christians.
- The Recovery: Paul experienced a dramatic conversion on the road to Damascus. He wrote a large portion of the New Testament and spread Christianity across the ancient world.
